# Blessings and Musings The Lutheran Church of Our Blessed Savior MAY, 2017

### From the Pastor:

When I do my morning walking outside, it is usually about the same time that our neighbors let their two little dogs out and they come out to the road and bark at me, just to show that they are doing their job of protecting the household. Recently, after their barking, one of the dogs began eating some grass. I have seen this before with dogs and it usually means that they have some digestive problem and are trying to make themselves vomit, so that they can get rid of whatever ails them and feel better. Sure enough, this is exactly what happened; the dog retched and vomited and walked away. That in and of itself is a little crude, but upon my return that dog did something that was much more gross — he came back and ate his own vomit!

This is quite Biblical, however. It turns out that the writers of Scripture had observed this same thing. In Proverbs 26:11 the verse says, "Like a dog that returns to its vomit is a fool who reverts to his folly". 2 Peter 2:22 adds another farm example by saying, "The dog turns back to its own vomit" and "the sow is washed only to wallow in the mud".

We could shake our heads at the folly of animals, but these passages are actually talking about people and how we are just like these animals in our own folly. I have done it myself many times and I have watched other people do it as well. We do something that doesn't work and then we go back and do the same thing only harder. We are involved in things we really cannot stomach, but then go back and pick up the same behaviors. My old colleague, Jim used to say, "We really don't make many mistakes in life – we just make the same ones over and over".

It happens in relationships. I don't know how many times I have seen women be in a sick relationship that includes abuse and belittling and finally get out of it, only to return later to the very same man who promises to be good, but then does the very same thing.

All addictive behavior involves this same returning to the vomit procedure. Alcoholics swear off the bottle and dump their booze down the drain, only to go to the liquor store two hours later to get some more. A woman who had an eating addiction was disgusted with herself for buying a big box of doughnuts and threw them down on the driveway and ran over them with the car. Twenty minutes later she was out on the driveway, scraping up the smashed pastry and eating it. One month ago 16 people in Muncie overdosed on literally some "killer heroin" and four were dead. But I already met one of the ones who didn't die, that had to come back to intensive care on, you guessed it, a heroin overdose.

We do the same thing sometimes with our family of origin. We may know that we come from a dysfunctional family that is damaging to be around, but keep trying to go back and make things right and get hurt again.

We may do it spiritually. We know that we can't sit on our anger and let it build into resentments that poison us, but then somebody does us wrong and we go back to our own vomit and start sitting on another resentment that hurts us.

We may know that being faithful in our spiritual practices keeps us strong and that when we pray, meditate and read Scripture, life goes better. However, it is so easy to go back to our old ways of doing nothing and then wondering why we don't seem close to God and why life seems futile. Like the old sow that is washed, we go back and lie in the mud hole.

This is really what the word "sin" is all about. We all have the inborn tendency to do that which hurts us and other people. We are drawn to going back and eating our own puke and wallowing in our same mud holes. That is why the word, "repent" is so important in Scripture. To repent doesn't just mean to say "I'm sorry", it means "to turn around". It is to do something different than we usually do. It is to go the opposite direction, with God's help.

King David was a man who knew what it was to mess up, but he also knew how to repent. We can follow King David and implore the Lord to "Create in me a clean heart, Oh God, and renew a right spirit within me".

If we have forgotten something, please forgive us because we are just little mice.

Daisies in a vase for Mother's Day, Sunday, May 14.


