From the Pastor:

Have you ever met anybody who has not experienced some tragedy because of addiction? Have you ever run into one person that says that they don't have anybody in their extended family that has any kind of dependency problem? No, I haven't either. Everybody I have ever met has had some kind of run-in with the disease of addiction. It might be alcohol and other drugs. It might be some of the other addictions such as: gambling, overeating, overspending, smoking, sexual addiction or computer/game/I-phone addiction. The problem might be with you yourself, somebody in your family or a close friend, but it is everywhere.

If this is true (and it is) then it would make sense that we would want to learn more about our country's biggest health problem and we would want to see if there are some things that we can do to prevent and treat the addictive illness.

That is why our congregations are sponsoring a nine part series on chemical dependency. We will begin the series on Sunday, March 4, 2018 and will conclude on May 6, 2018. Every Sunday evening, excluding Easter Sunday we will have another presentation at 7:00 p.m. in the church basement of The Lutheran Church of Our Blessed Savior. This lecture series will be filmed with the live audience so that the entire series can be on our church website and can be viewed not only by Lutherans, but by anybody who has the Internet. There will be a question and answer period at the end of each lecture.

Since almost my entire career has been spent working with addictions of various kinds, this is a subject that I know well. I have wanted to share this information with the community and with the Lutheran Church for a long time. I believe that my diverse experiences as Spiritual Care Counselor, Addiction Counselor, Nicotine Dependency Counselor, Chaplain, Marriage and Family Therapist and parish pastor give me a unique perspective to this disease that folks will find helpful.

The lectures are based on information from my book, "Knowledge to Power: Understanding and Overcoming Addiction". This book is currently being completed by Outskirts Press and will be sold by the publishing house as well as other outlets such as Amazon and Barnes and Noble. Hopefully, the book will be out at some point during the presentations.

The full range of issues that addictions raise will be discussed during the presentations. We will explain how addiction is a disease, a spiritual disease and a feelings disease. We will look at how our culture does not believe we should ever have any pain, either physical or emotional and how that sets us up for using quick-fix solutions. We will look not only at those who are afflicted with the

illness, but also at those who are affected by the illness, such as: codependents and Adult Children of Dysfunction. The emotions that drive addiction such as: guilt, shame, grief, loss, anger and fear will be explained. There will be an Intervention Specialist guest speaker to explain what a structured intervention involves to get an addicted person into treatment, even when they really don't want to go.

A section that should interest pastors and lay people in the Christian church is the section on religion and recovery. There are ways that the church both helps and hinders recovery for addicts and we will learn what things to do and what to avoid. We will discuss not only what is helpful, but when help should be given to an addicted person.

Most importantly, we will see that the church is a place that can help sick people without judgment and treat addicts as if they are "sick" and not just "bad". We will see the important place that the church can have in recovery for addicts and their families and how grace, forgiveness and love can heal.

I hope that as many of you as possible can attend the lectures. I will be including real-life stories in the presentations and I believe it will be interesting. And as most of you know by now, I won't be talking over anyone's head. I am known to be "plain-spoken". And, of course, since we are Lutherans, there will be free food served! Spread the word.




