Blessings and Musings The Lutheran Church of Our Blessed Savior JANUARY, 2019

From the Pastor:

When I was growing up in the Lutheran Church I had a kind of mixed message as to what Lutheranism could tolerate in terms of recreation. My mother was Scandinavian Lutheran and my father was German Lutheran.

Scandinavian Lutherans have a kind of piety that precludes certain activities such as: dancing, drinking and playing cards. German Lutherans on the other hand, believe that all of these things are part and parcel of being a Lutheran. I can remember the church picnics at the German Lutheran Church that always had two big horse troughs filled with ice and cold water. One tank was for cooling the soda pop and one tank held the beer. After the volleyball game was over the men would settle in around the tables in the shelter and play cards and drink beer. I don't remember any dancing, however. I guess that was reserved for the wedding receptions.

With the German Lutherans, as long as you had "pure doctrine" you could pretty much do whatever else you wanted, but the Scandinavian Lutherans had some real scruples about certain behaviors. It took my mother a long time to decide that playing euchre or hearts with the family was an appropriate behavior for a Lutheran, but she eventually began leaning towards the German side as she hung around my father and his family.

Therefore, as an apology to my mother's card-playing reservations, I offer to you a way that playing cards is very spiritual and Godly. My secretary, Julie enlightened me on the following information.

All of the different cards and numbers in a deck of cards have something that corresponds to something in the Scriptures. For example, the Aces are the same as number 1 and that reminds us that there is only one true God. The 2 reminds us that there are two testaments in the Bible, the Old and the New. The 3 of course, stands for the Holy Trinity, the three in one. The 4 represents the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The 5 hearkens back to Jesus parable of the five wise virgins who were prepared for the bridegroom's coming and the 5 foolish virgins who were not prepared. The 6 is for the six days that it took God to create the world. The 7 is then the seventh day of creation when God rested and when we rest and worship. The 8 is for Noah, his wife, their 3 sons and their 3 wives, a total of eight people that were saved in the ark during the flood. The 9 recalls the 9 ungrateful lepers who did not give thanks to Jesus for healing them. The 10 represents the Ten Commandments.

The face cards have their own meaning also. The Jack stands for Satan who is wise and sly and like a jack-in-the-box can spring upon us unawares. The Queen honors the most blessed of all women, Mary, the mother of Jesus. The King is for Jesus, the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords, the One who would be King of our hearts.

In addition, there are some other connections with a deck of cards. There are 4 suits of cards, which corresponds to the four seasons of the year. There are 52 cards in a deck and that connects to the 52 weeks that we have in a year. There are 13 cards in each suit and that brings to mind the thirteen weeks in each quarter of the year. Finally, if you add up all the spots on a deck of cards, you will find that there are exactly 365 spots and that is like the 365 days in a year.

Now, I'm not trying to tell you that if you dance, drink beer and play cards that you will become a much more devoted Christian, but I am reminding you that most things are what you make of them and anything can be abused or useful, depending on what you do with it.

Jesus was no killjoy. His first miracle was to turn water into wine for a wedding feast. Another time he made lunch for 5,000 people out of a few scraps. He made people feel special with just a look of acceptance. He healed their diseases and saw past their shortcomings. He didn't come to make our lives restricted and boring. He came that we might have life and have it abundantly. So, deal the cards and remember the Lord!

We need the church


I've never understood those who say they don't need the church. Mine is a profound need to worship and to live in solidarity with the community of the faithful.
