From the Pastor:

In the last newsletter we informed the congregation about the possibility of St. John Lutheran and the Lutheran Church of Our Blessed Savior becoming a shared ministry. Another term for this is a two-point parish. As we said, this does not mean the two churches would merge as one, but would still have their own identity and place of worship and ministry. However, the cooperation would be better and there could be more sharing of staff and resources.

In order to become a two-point parish, some things would have to be accomplished. The percentage of financial support from each congregation would have to be agreed upon for the new entity. For example, there could be a 60-40 split of financial support, because OBS is the larger congregation and would take on the larger portion. This would also mean that I would be spending more time proportionately in ministry for OBS, however. Both congregations would have to have a congregational vote to decide if they want to go along with what both of the church councils are recommending. Then a new call would have to be issued to me, since I am currently only called to Our Blessed Savior and am just contracted year to year at St. John.

Many of the conditions for a two-point parish are already in place. Both churches already share a minister. The worship times are already in place for both parishes. We have a combined choir and a combined Bible study. We already take turns hosting festival worship services. We already have begun to attend and support each other's functions. In many ways we have been functioning as a shared ministry, but this would make the cooperation and use of resources even better.

It is no secret that as our members die off and are not replaced, the financial condition of both congregations is a real concern. St. John Lutheran is month to month trying to stay ahead of the expenses. Our Blessed Savior is taking money every month out of savings and this can only go on at this rate for another couple of years.

The executive committee has suggested that I would take the new call of the two-point parish as a three quarters time minister instead of full time. This would reduce the budget by about \$16,000.00 and would make it possible for both congregations to continue as they are. I have accepted this proposal if the two churches vote to become a shared ministry.

There is no need to fear that my being three quarters time means that some ministerial duties will go lacking. Basically, I will still be doing everything that I am doing now, but for less money. So, for example, if there are four funerals in a

month, I won't be saying that I can only do three of them, because I'm three quarters time. It won't mean that I will only do three of the four Bible studies in the month or only do 3 sermons in a month. It won't mean that the sermons are only three quarters as long as before!

But what it will mean is that when time allows, I will probably be taking more time to do some things I want to do, such as visiting the grandchildren and spending more time outside working on the Ponderosa or even making more time to have lunch with friends. I will still make sure that all the responsibilities of both churches are taken care of, probably because I am too compulsive not to.

I believe that this new plan of two-point parish and three quarters time is going to be essential for the survival of both congregations. This will also set us up well for the future for when I drop over dead or retire. The new combined budget would support a young minister on a full-time basis, because he or she would have a lower base salary than someone with my years of experience and my advanced certifications. This new entity with two congregations that are doing vital work in their respective communities and a reasonable salary would make an attractive position for a young clergy person and their family.

I hope both congregations think about this possibility and pray about it. I believe the church councils have come up with a good plan for our future.




