I am currently called to Our Blessed Savior, but am only contracted year to year at St. John. I would have to receive a call to the new entity of the two point parish if both congregations vote to begin this shared ministry. This is not a big deal, since I have been functioning as the pastor of both parishes for over 8 years and I would accept such a call.

This possibility has had me reflecting on the whole notion of the divine call. Lutherans teach that a person is called to ministry and then called to minister at a particular place. A minister stays at that place until he or she feels called to a different place or different kind of ministry.

As far as the original call to ministry, I really cannot explain that. I knew that I was going to be a Lutheran minister towards the end of my sixth grade year of school. I don't really know how to describe it. I didn't have a blinding light that knocked me off my horse like Saul did when he became Paul. I had no ministers in my family background, so it was not carrying on a family tradition. I just gradually became attracted to the notion that I wanted to not just have a job, but I wanted a profession and something that was important.

I know that I was influenced by our new pastor. His son was my age and became my best friend and I spent a lot of time in the parsonage. I found out that ministers were just regular people who put their pants on one leg at a time just like everybody else, but they dealt with things that were important like: God, family, birth, death and relationships. Our pastor was sincere and interesting, but he was also fun and I was drawn to him.

Certainly my family of origin was a great influence on me also. My grandfather was a great man of faith and loved the Lord and served him every day. Every day of the week after supper you could see Grandpa John sitting at the dining room table with his big Bible out reading Scriptures. He was a simple, hard-working farmer and had few needs of his own, but was always generous to the church and to others in need. If a thing was right, it was right and you did it and if a thing was wrong, it was wrong and you didn't do it. It was that simple.


My parents set a terrific example when it came to faith life and the church. We never asked if we were going to church. If it was Sunday, we were going. If there was work to do at the church, we were going to be doing it. We had devotions at home and discussions about our faith at the supper table. My mother and father had a rock solid faith that the Lord knew what he was doing and if tough times came, they knew the Lord would be with them to see it through.

I believe that all of these people and these experiences somehow added up to my feeling called to professional ministry. But I am not the only one that is called by God. Martin Luther made it clear that every Christian has a calling. He called it the royal priesthood of all believers. That means that you are called to be a Christian wherever you are.

You may be called to be a Christian farmer, a Christian teacher, a Christian homemaker, a Christian nurse or a Christian grandparent. Wherever you are and whatever you do, you are called to do it as a Christian, with all of the values and moral standards that Christ showed us when he was on this earth.

There is not a big distinction between being a pastor and being a lay person. One does not have a calling and the other simply a job. Every Christian has a calling and what you do in your little part of the world is as important as anyone else's calling.

We are all called by God in our baptisms to be followers of Him and part of His family. We live out our baptismal calling when we share the love of God in Christ Jesus by what we say and by what we do in our daily lives. When we do that we are definitely walking wet in our baptisms and living out our calling.


PRAYER LIST




