From the Pastor:

Every spring before the cows arrive to be turned out on my pasture, I have to walk the fence line to make sure the fence is still intact. This has become a much bigger task over the past few years ever since the Emerald Ash borer arrived here and killed all the Ash trees. Now these dead trees have become brittle and some crack and fall down right on the fence. This year I had 5 different spots where the fence was smashed down by fallen trees.

Another complicating factor is that many trees have fallen into Lilly creek that runs through my property and there are huge log jams up and down the stream. Now when we get a big rain, I can always expect that the creek is going to back up and flood my front pasture until the whole thing is underwater. I talked to the County Surveyor and they said that sometime this summer they would come with equipment to clean out some of these log jams, so that might help.

One of these log jams floated down and ripped out the hanging gate that used to prevent the cows from walking down the creek and into the neighbor's property. There really needs to be some kind of barrier there over the creek, because you just can't count on a cow's good nature to stay where you want her to without a clear boundary.

Water is powerful, whether it is a creek, a pond, a lake or the ocean. It is beautiful and it is dangerous. It is life-giving and life-taking. It is soothing and it is irritating. It is calming and it is unnerving.

In Scripture, water is described in all of these both positive and negative terms. Water was important in a desert country, but the deep waters are also a symbol of chaos in the Old Testament.

Jesus talked about "living waters" which meant that the spirit of God was within a person and they had a good relationship with the Lord and then things flowed smoothly. Jesus description sounds like a nice stream with no log jams.

As Christians we all have this living water in us, but unfortunately, sometimes things get jammed up. We may be jammed by resentments to others that have piled up. We may be blocked by perfectionism that keeps us from trying anything new. The flow may be interrupted by guilt over things we have done wrong or by the shame of the wrongs that others have done to us. There could be a stack of false pride that keeps us from admitting our mistakes and learning from them.

Whatever jams up the flow of our living waters can leave us flooded and overwhelmed and drowning. Hopefully, we can do some work this year and remove the blockages that stop the flow and then we can go with the flow!
