Southwest Airlines has a commercial on television that shows a hectic life and ends with the tag line, "Need to get away?" This would be a very fitting sentiment for Jesus as He is described in our past two Gospel lessons. Jesus is devastated because His front man, the great prophet, John the Baptizer has just been beheaded and Jesus definitely needs to get away and be by Himself to grieve and pray and meditate. However, the crowds will not let him rest and he ends up feeding 5,000 people. Then he tries to get away again and he has to rescue the disciples from the storm and walk on the water to save them.

Jesus has a serious case of compassion fatigue. I remember that at the hospital there used to be a big poster on the board that warned about "compassion fatigue" in health care workers. It noted that when we take care of other people and empathize with them and give of ourselves until we feel that we have nothing left to give; that is compassion fatigue. That is what Jesus had and He needed some time to get away, be by Himself, grieve and think.

It strikes me that we may be having some compassion fatigue of our own in the congregations. There are folks who are in nursing homes and folks who are shutins who need a lot of care now and some of the caregivers may be getting weary. Worry, care and grieving all take their toll after a while.

At Our Blessed Savior this notion of compassion fatigue is particularly apt, because we have had 4 funerals in about 5 weeks and it is becoming a burden that we all feel. Family members have been running back and forth to the hospital and planning funerals and crying and talking to each other. The women have had several funeral dinners to prepare and although they do it very willingly, it still is a bit of a strain after several weeks in a row. Not only that, but we have at least one or two more members who are not doing well and may be the next funeral in the very near future.

I must confess that I have felt some of this fatigue myself. The members who have died recently have all been faithful members that I knew pretty well and it takes more out of me to do a funeral service for folks that I knew and loved than for strangers. When I look out at those front rows with the family members grieving and the grandchildren looking up at me with big tears in their eyes it seems to drain energy from me.

The Lord has promised that He would not give us more than we can bear, but sometimes I wish He wouldn't trust us so much. We could use a break, Lord.






PICNIC AT THE PONDEROSA


